### Describe:

Driver came around a corner on WV-92N and found a WV Highways truck stopped in the lane due to a downed power line. Driver attempted to pass the stopped vehicle in the left lane and lost control of his unit. Driver left the roadway and rolled over. Diesel fuel dripped out of the top vent following the rollover. Buckets were placed immediately to collect and contain the spill of 20 gallons. The area was baled off within thirty minutes.
