Describe:

This was a three vehicle accident. A car merged onto the freeway erratically in front of another 18 wheeler (cowtown redmix) which was traveling in the second lane to the right on a four lane highway. The driver of the redmix truck made an unsafe lane change into our tanker truck which was in the second lane. The impact caused our tanker truck to loose control and hit the center barrier and roll over on its driver side. The driver and passenger or the driver of the redmix truck never came into contact with the fuel released from our tanker truck. Our driver had minor injuries from the accident but not from the material released. The Dallas FD chose to let the release burn off rather than spray it with water. The release after the fire was put out was minimal and was contained in the storm sewer and creek with containment boom. The release was reported to NRC and TCEQ and a Haz-Mat crew was dispatched as soon as we were notified of the accident. TCEQ and the city of Dallas had representatives on site to assure the response and remediation was taken care of. The truck was carrying 6835 Unleaded, 1010 Premium Unleaded, and 949 Diesel Fuel
