During the twilight shift in the Commerce City UPS Hub, employees noticed several packages on a conveyor belt that were on fire. Initial response with fire extinguishers was ineffective. The building was evacuated and fire department called. The fire department extinguished the fire and allowed reoccupancy of offices at 2330 hours and the rest of the building at 00:50 hours. The fire department determined the source of the fire was a 5-gallon pail of methanol, which was shipped in a fiberboard overpak. The cap for the pail had come off and the majority of the fiberboard had been destroyed by fire.
