Describe:

DOWX 71071, loaded tank car, was involved in a derailment in La Grande, OR. Investigation of the derailed cars found this car to be releasing product from the bottom outlet valve mounting flange. All 8 bolts to the flange were too tight. The car was trans-loaded to highway vehicles and is to be home shopped for repair.

Further investigation revealed a deteriorated gasket. These results indicate the release was present prior to the derailment occurring and that the derailment was not the cause of the release. There was no physical damage to any of the valves.
