Describe:

Vehicle #1 exited from 1—20 West in the right lane of the exit ramp to GA 70. AS Vehicle #1 traveled down the ramp it left the roadway on the north shoulder of the ramp. Vehicle #1 entered the grass and traveled 50 feet before crossing the end of the curb leaving tire marks and tire impressions in the grass and on the curb. As the driver of Vehicle #1 attempted to negotiate the right turn at the end of the ramp, tie load of jet fuel shifted to the left side of the vehicle causing it to overturn onto its left side in the middle northbound lane of GA 70. The vehicle then slid 20 feet across the remaining inside northbound lane of GA 70, striking the center median curb and rolling up onto it's back and coming to final rest. The tank trailer was damaged as a result of the accident causing approximately 2600 gallons of jet fuel to be released onto the roadway. Appropriate government agencies were notified and a remediation contractor was contracted to clean—up the jet fuel spill according to the state of Georgia environmental standards.
