EAGLE TRANSPORT DRIVER LOUIS LOUVETT WAS TRAVELING SOUTH ON RT 168 BUSINESS IN HEAVY FOG. HE FAILED TO NEGOTIATE A SHARP TURN TO THE LEFT AND STRUCK A GUARD RAIL ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE VEHICLE. HE TURNED THE WHEEL TO THE LEFT AND OVERTURNED THE TRUCK. HE WAS CARRYING A LOAD OF GASOLINE AND DIESEL FUEL. THERE WAS BETWEEN 4,000 - 6,000 GALLONS OF FUEL SPILLED. IMS ENVIRONMENTAL AND ACTION ENVIRONMENT WERE CALLED TO THE SCENE TO INVESTIGATE THE SPILL ON EAGLE'S BEHALF. THE CONTAMINATED PRODUCT WAS PUMPED FROM A DITCH AND ALL OTHER CONTAMINATES WERE TAKEN CARE BY IMS. NO WATERWAYS WERE AFFECTED.
