Describe:

According to the information obtained, the following occurred. While traveling on Route 9 East, driver was involved in a vehicle accident, which caused the cargo tank truck to rollover. Two (2) tanks were connected to the truck, one (1) which contained approximately 7,999 gallons of fuel oil, and one (1) which contained approximately 2,000 gallons of diesel fuel. The entire contents of the tank(s) were released to the roadway, entered into the nearby storm drains, and ran down into a culvert. The Highway Department responded with sand trucks to attempt to contain the free product. Western Mass Environmental of West Springfield, Massachusetts was dispatched to perform the cleanup. Western Mass Environmental assisted the local authorities, and responding agencies in recovering the free product. Approximately 8,000 gallons of free product were recovered with the use of their vacuum truck. The storm drainage system was flushed to recover all residual products and prevent migration to the nearby River. A Licensed Site Professional (LSP) was hired to oversee cleanup activity, and prepare necessary report documentation, as required by MADEP. Crews worked on site for several days to cleanup all affected areas and restore site to preexisting condition.

Since the release was accidental, and appears to be related to a vehicle accident, no plans currently exist to prevent recurrence. United Transport of East Longmeadow, Inc. will continue to train and reinforce safe handling procedures and driver safety to all personnel.
