Describe:

Tank car SRIX 33815 was reported emanating commodity odor while in the railyard. SRIX 33815 was cordoned-off in the railyard and yard operations were subsequently suspended. Contract responders inspecting SRIX 33815 determined the commodity odor/vapor was emanating from the top style Midland 280.5 psi pressure relief valve's (PRV) bolted connection to the tank cars pressure plate and from the PRV's top cap area. An emergency response kit (Midland Capping Kit) was applied over the PRV to seal off escaping commodity vapor/odor by 0700 CDT, 9/08/2014. Afterwards, SRIX 33815 was carefully moved and isolated in the railyard awaiting commodity transfer.

On 9/16/2014, contract responders transferred commodity within SRIX 33815 to another suitable tank car which was accomplished without incident by 1630 hrs. CDT, 9/16/2014. Air monitoring was initiated before and throughout the transfer process with no detectable levels of ammonia recorded. Afterwards, responders removed the applied Midland Capping mechanism and tool tightened the PRV flange bolt nuts (approximately two turns each). In addition, the PRV's O-rings were removed and replaced. The removed O-rings appeared to have signs of chemical degradation and flattening (compression set). The removed O-rings were sent to Carolina Seal for root cause failure analysis. After the PRV was secure, no commodity odor or vapor release was detectable. Responders re-inspected SRIX 33815 in the morning of 9/17/2014 and no commodity vapor leakage or odor was detected.
