On August 19, 2015 at 0030 ET, an IMG Trucking tractor (R5313) trailer (R5313) encountered a mechanical failure in which the trailer became disconnected from the tractor then crashed into the roadside hill at 60 MPH. Twenty-two 30-gallon poly drums containing UN1824 "Blue Coral HI pH 3692" released their entire contents to the asphalt roadway and soil shoulder. A cleanup contractor was dispatched to perform the remediation. All generated waste was transported off site for disposal.

On August 19, 2015 at 0030 ET, an IMG Trucking tractor (R5313) trailer (R5313) encountered a mechanical failure in which the trailer became disconnected from the tractor then crashed into the roadside hill at 60 MPH. Two 5-gallon pails of UN3266 "Soilaway" were compromised, releasing a total of 10 gallons to the asphalt roadway and soil shoulder. A cleanup contractor was dispatched to perform the remediation. All generated waste was transported off site for disposal.

Two 5-gallon pails of UN3266 "Soilaway" were compromised, releasing a total of 10 gallons to the asphalt roadway and soil shoulder. A cleanup contractor was dispatched to perform the remediation. All generated waste was transported off site for disposal.

On August 19, 2015 at 0030 ET, an IMG Trucking tractor (R5313) trailer (R5313) encountered a mechanical failure in which the trailer became disconnected from the tractor then crashed into the roadside hill at 60 MPH. Four 5-gallon pails of UN1824 "Tire & Wheel Cleaner" were compromised and released 20 gallons to the asphalt roadway and soil shoulder. A cleanup contractor was dispatched to perform the remediation. All generated waste was transported off site for disposal.
