Describe:

The hose connection piece used to unload the railcar into totes failed. The railcar did not have a safety valve on the flange, and our safety valve was above the breakage point. Once this connection broke, material was forced through the flange due to the railcar being pressurized. The air being fed into the railcar for pressurizing was stopped and we were forced to wait for all pressure to be released through the release of the material. The release lasted no more than 15 minutes, with the flow decreasing once the air feed line was disabled.

We have ordered teflon lined steel fittings to attach to railcar flanges to prevent future breakage. We have also begun research into the design of a portable flange with a safety valve for unloading pressurized railcars.
