Our vehicle was traveling east bound on I-20 in the right lane. A vehicle behind us failed to control its speed and struck our vehicle. The other vehicle pushed our vehicle onto the shoulder, and back across the east bound lanes of I-20, through the cable barrier system, and into the west bound of I-20. Our vehicle overturned and came to rest on its left side facing south our driver evacuated the vehicle at that time. A vehicle was traveling west bound on I-20 in the left lane, it failed to control its speed and ran into our vehicle. The vehicle only caused cargo damage to our vehicle. The packages began to leak through the vent cap when our truck was overturned.
