On 12-11-14 at 1:15 pm, a company driver arrived at the Chemical Waste Management Sulphur, Louisiana facility had a product delivery line fail and release waste ash to the ground. The waste ash was released due to a failure in modified unload coupling during dry bulk delivery. The approximate amount of ash released was 1,000 pounds. The released material was on-site over secondary containment area. Released material was cleaned by site personnel.
