(A - B) THE DRIVER WAS ON HIGHWAY 17 NEARING THE INTERSECTION OF GLENWOOD DRIVE. AS THE DRIVER CRESTED A HILL AND STARTED THE DOWNGRADE AT APPROXIMATELY 35 MILES PER HOUR, THE DRIVER OBSERVED THE TRAILER BEGIN TO SWING FROM SIDE TO SIDE. THE DRIVER IMMEDIATELY TRIED TO STOP THE VEHICLE BUT BEFORE HE COULD DO SO, THE TRAILER ROLLED OVER ON ITS LEFT SIDE. PRODUCT BEGAN LEAKING FROM THE RUPTURED CARGO TANK. AFTER FURTHER INVESTIGATION, IT WAS APPARENT THAT THE RIGHT REAR COMPOSITE SPRING HAD BROKEN JUST PRIOR TO THE ROLLOVER. IT IS ALSO NOTED THAT THE COMPOSITE SPRING HAD BEEN REPLACED ON JANUARY 5, 2000. THE CAUSE OF THE ROLLOVER IS BELIEVED TO BE FROM A MANUFACTURER COMPOSITE SPRING DEFECT. THE SPRING MANUFACTURER IS DELPHI AUTOMOTIVE SYSTEMS.
