Describe:

Vehicle was traveling east on S-06-190 (Yenome Rd). Vehicle traveled off right side of the roadway, overturned to the right, the driver crawled to the roadside where a passerby found him. The unknown passerby called and reported the incident to 911. The dome lid of the #5 compartment leaked Jet A fuel 8 hours and 22minutes. Approximately 3,238 LGA leaked into a contained area on the ground. Pametto Wrecker Service and Terracon Consultants, Inc mitigated the release.
