## Describe:

On February 15th, 2025, at 18:00 hours, personnel in the CSXT Montgomery, Alabama Yard discovered GATX 53808, a loaded tank car of Terpene Hydrocarbons NOS, leaking from the manway. The car was isolated and the shipper, Kraton Chemicals, was notified via CHEMTREC (Report 20250215-00065). Marion Environmental, a CSXT emergency response contractor, was dispatched to the scene and found the manway cover gasket improperly installed- allowing product to release from the car. Contractor personnel replaced the manway cover gasket and decontaminated the exterior of the car. Following securement of the car it was released for transportation. The issues identified and corrective actions were communicated to the shipper's representative (Gerri Sage).
